The session was aimed at motivating the students by sharing real-life experiences of two individuals who have achieved significant milestones in their defense careers

Session details:

- **Lieutenant Shambhuraj Shivraj Patil** : an alumnus and currently serving in Garhwal Rifles Indian Army, shared his journey and experiences, providing invaluable insights to students aspiring for a career in the Indian Armed Forces.

Lt. Shambhuraj Shivraj Patil, who entered the forces through the Technical Entry, spoke extensively about the opportunities available to engineering graduates in the defense forces. He explained how the technical entry scheme



allows candidates with strong academic backgrounds in engineering to contribute to the military's technological and operational efficiency.

As an Officer in the Indian Army, Lt. Shambhuraj Patil described his role in patrolling in high altitude areas of Ladakh, conducting surveillance missions. He emphasized the critical importance relating to having hold of high altitude areas for protection of the nation and also described the soldiers feelings of Patriotism for his nation which makes him so strong to survive in difficult environments like the mountainous regions of Northern India.

He also talked about the rigorous training that shaped his skills as a leader and a soldier. His journey from being a student at KIT to becoming an officer demonstrated how dedication, mental toughness, and a passion for serving the country are essential qualities for success in the defense forces.

In a motivating tone, Lt. Shambhuraj Patil encouraged students to explore the various pathways to a career in the Indian Armed Forces, whether through technical entry, CDS, or AFCAT. He highlighted the pride and honor that comes with wearing the uniform, stressing that it's not just a career but a lifelong commitment to the nation.

The session concluded with Lt. Shambhuraj Patil answering questions from the students, providing them with practical advice on preparing for SSB, maintaining physical fitness, and developing the leadership qualities needed to thrive in the Armed Forces

He stressed that the key to success lies in self-confidence, the ability to remain calm under pressure, and consistent practice, he also told the importance of failures in the life as it teaches us and gives us another chance for growth.

Yash encouraged fellow students to start early in their preparation, not just academically but also by working on soft skills like communication, teamwork, and leadership. He urged students aspiring for a technical career in the Armed Forces to stay updated with advancements in defense technologies, as these play a crucial role in interviews and tasks at the SSB.

Activity Overview:

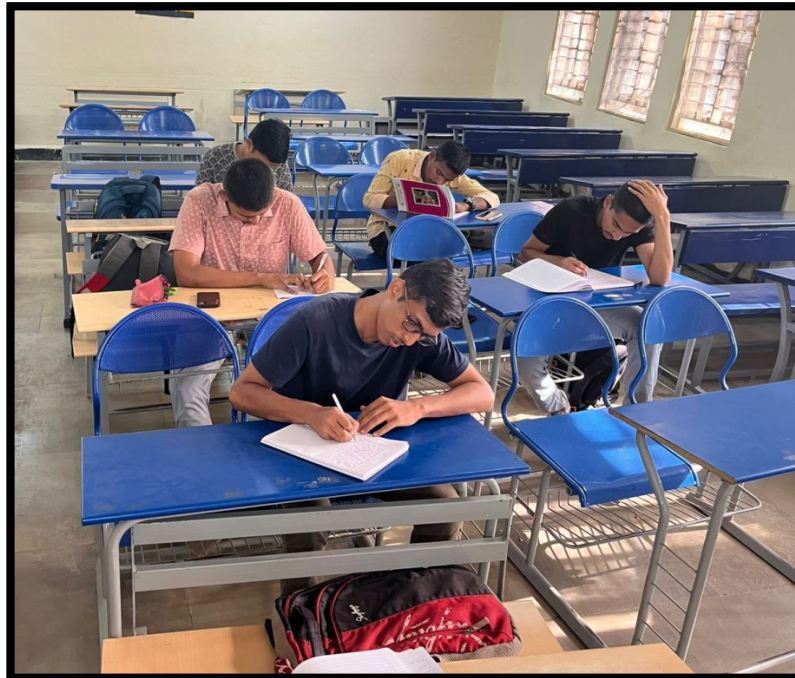

Activity Overview:

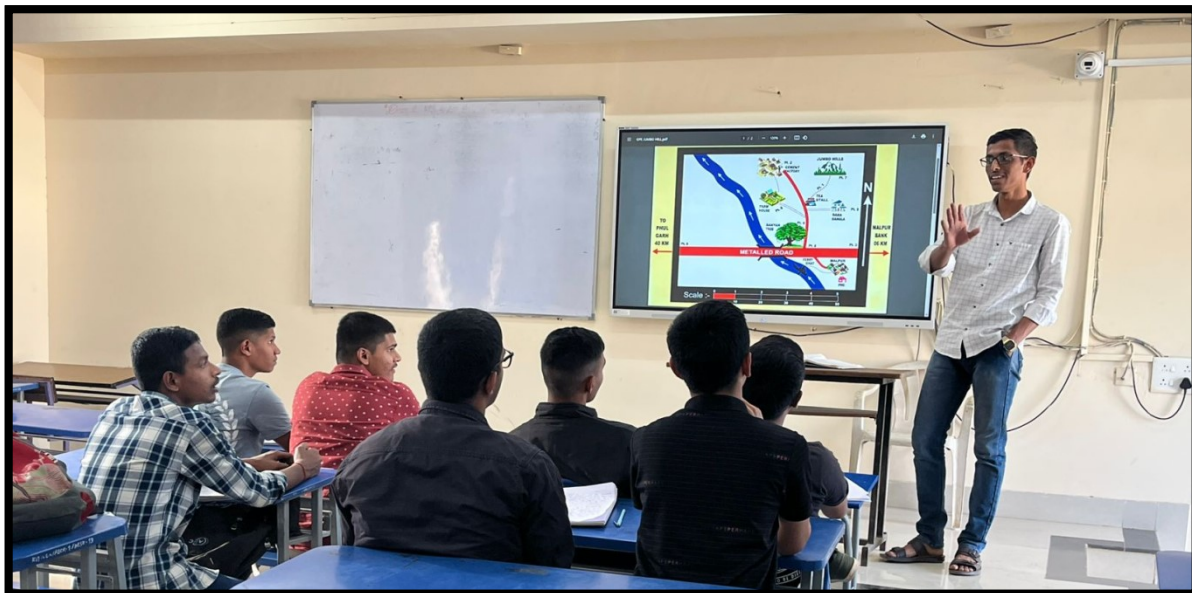
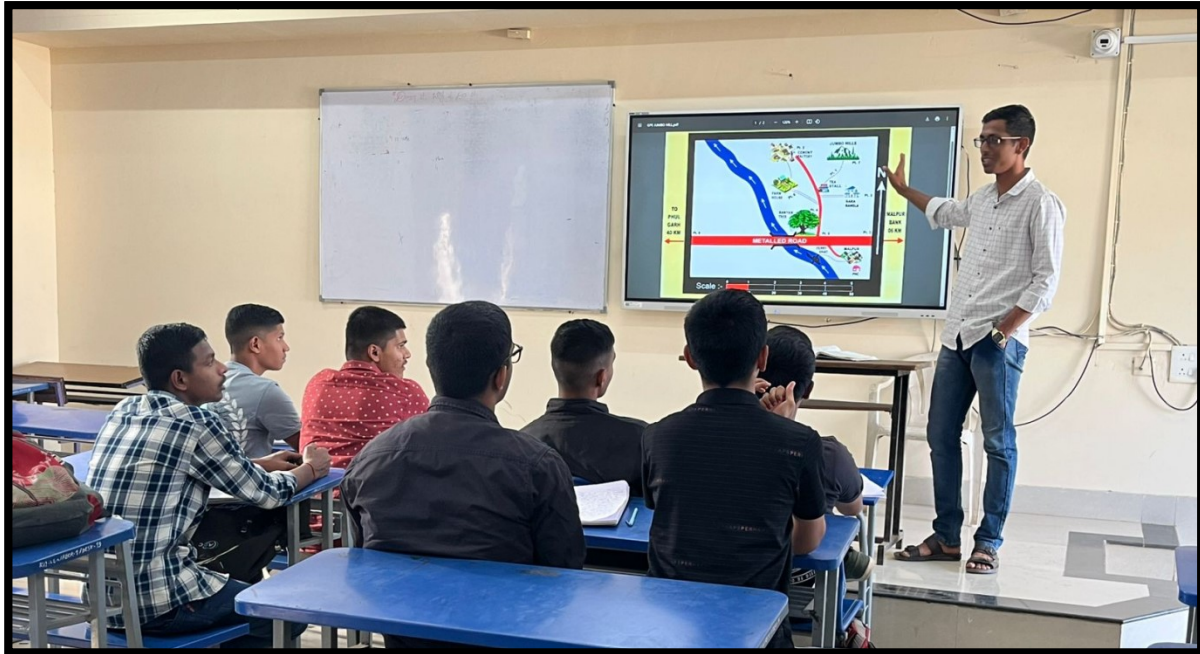
